### Make a garden treasure box


Any box will do...chose treasures your toddler finds in the park or garden; stones, feathers, leaves etc.

#### **Shakers**

You can use any container with a firmly attached lid and put in dry pasta, rice, beans or peas, buttons etc. to sing along with the Shake Shak-ah song. Younger babies could roll the shaker across the floor.

## Make a butterfly finger puppet

Double this template wing on felt and cut out with two body templates. Sew up the sides of the body leaving the bottom open for your finger and a space at the top for the antenna. Sew on felt eyes and use cord for the antenna.
